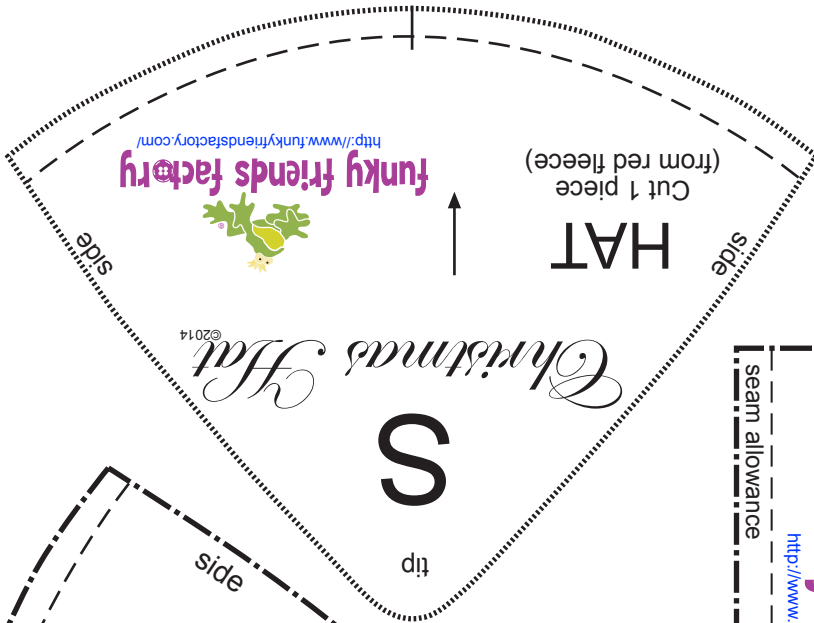

Christmas Hat ©2014

HAT

Cut 1 piece
(from red fleece)

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side

*** Enlarge 250% (2½ x) for kiddies Hat, 300%(3x) for teenagers and 350% (3½ x) for Adults ***

*** Enlarge 250% (2½ x) for kiddies Hat, 300% (3x) for teenagers and 350% (3½ x) for Adults Hat ***

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HAT BAND

cut 1 piece
(from white fleece or minkee)

seam allowance



STEP 1

- Fold the HAT BAND PIECE in half, along the fold line with the fabric RIGHT SIDES OUT!
- Pin the HAT BAND PIECE to the HAT PIECE with the fabric right sides together.

TIP:

Use more pins for the bigger hats to stop the fabric slipping as you sew - fleece and minkee are NOT fun to unpick!



STEP 2

- Sew the HAT BAND and HAT PIECE together and zig-zag this seam to neaten the edge and reduce the bulk of all the layers.



STEP 3

- Fold the HAT BAND down and fingerpress it open so it lays nice and flat.



STEP 4

- Fold the HAT with fabric right sides together and sew it closed along the side.
- Sew the HAT closed down the side.



STEP 5

- Turn the HAT right sides out.

TIP:

I like to use a wooden chopstick to push the tip out nicely.



STEP 6

- Sew a bell at the tip of the HAT.

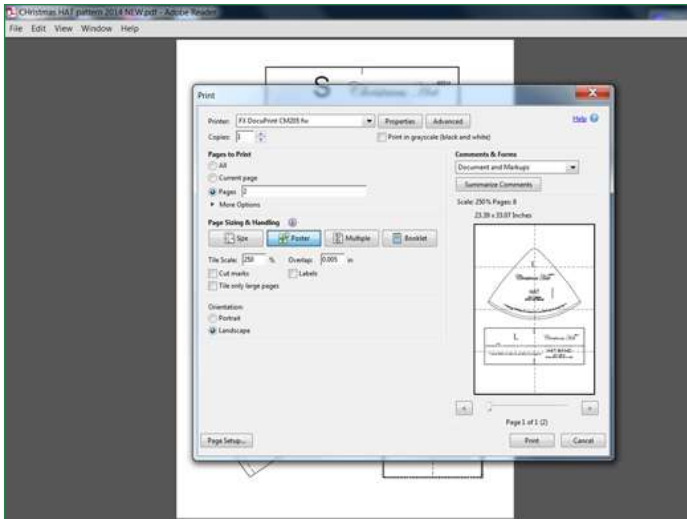
TIP:

Make sure it is nice and secure, sew at least 5x through the loop of the bell.



STEP 7

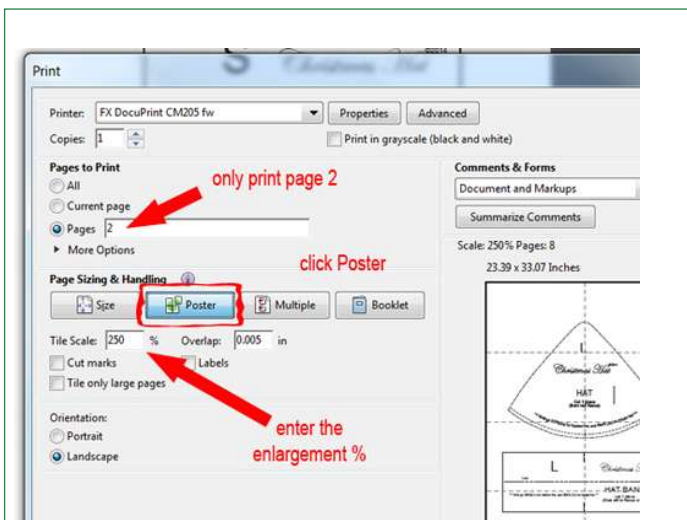
- The toy hats only use small amounts of fleece - so go wild and make HEAPS!!!



STEP 8

- Open the PDF in Adobe Reader to print **Page 3 ONLY** at the enlarged sizes for the 'human' HATS.

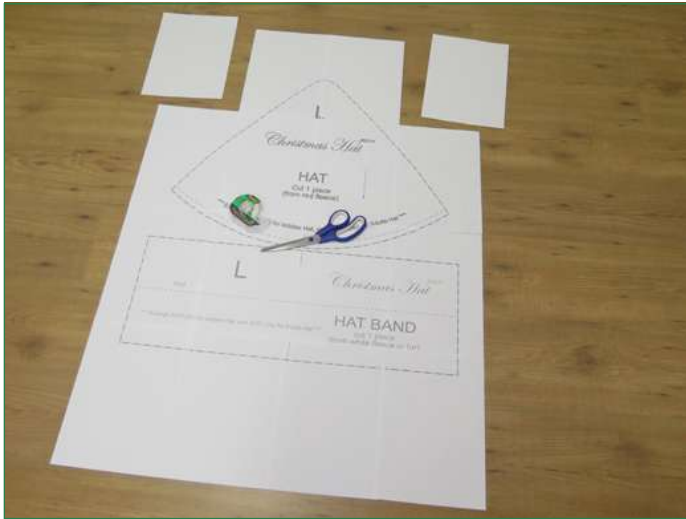
Adobe Reader is FREE and you can get it here if you haven't got it already - www.adobe.com



STEP 9

- Enter **Page 3 ONLY** for the Pages to Print (or you'll waste a LOT of paper!)
- Click on the **Poster** option for the Page Settings (so that the hat pieces will print out as a poster made of lots of pages.)
- Enter the enlargement size eg. 250% for the Tile Scale %, then print.

(The preview shows you how many pages it will print on.)



STEP 10

- Use sticky tape to join the pages together and cut out the enlarged PIECES.
- Repeat step 9 and 10 for the 300% and 350% sizes.

Important TIP:

Label the pieces with the size (eg 250%) because all the adult hats look the same as you use the Large toy hat for all the adult hats.)



STEP 11

- Cut out and sew the human hats like you did for the toy hats BUT use minkee for the BAND PIECES
- Sew the hats with the seam allowance shown on the pattern pieces - it will be enlarged too!

TIP:

The human hats are quite big so I used a rotary cutter to cut them out which is much quicker than scissors if you are making lots of hats!



STEP 12

- Use a bigger bell for the bigger hats if you can find them. (I found mine in a pop-up Christmas bargain store at the local shopping centre!)



STEP 13

- You will whip up these hats in no time, so make LOTS and give them to ALL your friends and family.



STEP 14
